

Hanjin Shipping is expanding its service network in Indonesia by adding new services to the region.

With NCI (New China-Indonesia) launching on April 3rd (ETD Qingdao), Hanjin Shipping will be jointly operating with T.S. Lines and KMTC to run a weekly service with 4 of 2,500TEU class ships deployed by the partner carriers.

In addition, Hanjin Shipping is adding JIS (Japan-Indonesia Service) and JIE (Japan Indonesia Express) to its service network at the end of March. Both JIS and JIE are jointly operated by NYK and K-Line. Existing JIS will be going through some changes in port coverage and rotation effective March 27th and JIE will be newly introduced as of March 28th. 4 of 2,500~2,900TEU class ships are deployed in these services respectively and Hanjin Shipping will be participating through space swap program.

Hanjin Shipping comments that the introduction of these services will enhance their network and market presence in the Indonesian market where demand is rapidly grow along with the economic development.
