Korean Air to increase cargo capacity on Incheon-Vladivostok route

○ Korean Air will operate B777-200 aircraft on the ICN-VVO route

Starting Sept.1, Korean Air will operate B777-200ER instead of B737-900ER on its Seoul Incheon (ICN) – Vladivostok (VVO) route. From the operation of wide-body aircraft, the cargo capacity from Seoul Incheon will increase to 10 tons per flight, 70tons weekly.

Korean Air's service to Vladivostok will depart from Seoul Incheon every day at 9:50 a.m. and will arrive in Vladivostok at 2:30 p.m. the same day. The return flight will depart from Vladivostok at 3:45 p.m., arriving in Seoul Incheon at 4:30 p.m. on the same day.

Vladivostok is known to be the main city of the Primorsky Kvai region of Russia, which has the largest economy in the far eastern region and to have the largest Russian port on the Pacific Ocean. The aircraft will be operated from the new terminal at Vladivostok airport, which was built for the APEC summit meeting.
