DHL Global Forwarding Belgium expands its temperature controlled facilities at Brussels Airport

 DHL Global Forwarding Belgium, part of the Deutsche Post Group, has announced the extension of its temperature controlled facilities at Brussels Airport. The existing GDP licensed three-zone temperature controlled area of 1750sqm was extended to a total 5300 sqm area.

Brucargo, May 8th 2017: "This extension confirms our ambition to remain a leading provider of logistics services to the life science and healthcare industry," **CEO Luc Jacobs** says," our growth in that particular market segment proves we have been growing our expertise and delivering value to our customers. As the market leader we are expected to have the proper infrastructure in place in order to deliver service excellence".

The temperature controlled warehouse area will now have 2700 pallet positions split over three temperature zones, the largest being for goods to be handled between +15°C to + 25°C degrees.

"We have seen a growing demand for pharmaceutical goods and devices which previously were handled as general cargo but now demand a strict temperature handling. We needed to respond quickly. We are proud we managed to build this extension in only 3 months' time meanwhile ensuring business continuity", says **Charles De Vuyst**, Physical Operations Director.

DHL Global Forwarding Belgium was also the first station worldwide to be **Thermonet certified.** Thermonet is the official DGF standard for handling temperature controlled movements. Since then, DHL Global Forwarding Belgium remained a leading life science and healthcare competence center within the DGF network offering not only transportation but also specific packaging services to its customers.

The facility also allows **in-house screening** through X-ray or EDD ensuring cargo is secured without additional external handling.

The extension is now under process of licensing by the official health authorities. A process which requires quite some preparation, certainly taking into account the narrow time spam in which the project was handled. As states **Alexandra Davin**, LS& H Compliance Manager,
