



RUS Aviation Cargo Plane
Pulled into the Guinness Book of Records

When Nissan Patrol decided to flex its muscles and set a brand new Guinness World Record with its latest top of the range SUV, they contacted RUS Aviation to “lend” them a cargo plane to pull over a distance of over 50 metres.
